ENGINEERING GRANTS, FELLOWSHIPS, & SCHOLARSHIPS

Amelia Earhart Fellowship for Women - Zonta International Foundation

Awarded annually to women pursuing higher education in aerospace-related sciences and aerospace-related engineering.

• Award: \$10,000 USD

• Eligibility: Women of any nationality; pursuing

Ph.D./doctoral degrees

• Deadline: November 15

American Association of University Women (AAUW) — Selected Professions Fellowship

Supports women in graduate and professional degree programs in fields where female participation traditionally has been low.

• Award: \$5,000-\$18,000 USD

• Eligibility: U.S. Citizen or permanent resident; full-time student

• Deadline: January 10

American Chemical Society Scholars Program

Awards renewable scholarships to underrepresented minority students who want to enter the fields of chemistry or chemistry-related fields.

• Award: Up to \$5,000 USD

• Eligibility: 3.0 GPA; U.S. citizen or permanent resident; full-time student; African American, Hispanic or American Indian

• Deadline: March 1

American Concrete Institute (ACI) Graduate Scholarships

Offers scholarships for eligible graduate students whose studies relate to concrete.

 Eligibility: Bachelor degree; accepted to graduate school

American Council of Engineering Companies (ACEC) Scholarships

Awards scholarships of varying amounts to outstanding U.S. citizens entering the junior or senior year and be enrolled in an accredited college program.

ASME Graduate Teaching Fellowship Program

GTF's are a collaboration between ASME and university mechanical (or related) engineering departments to encourage doctoral candidates to pursue a career in engineering education.

Barry Goldwater Scholarship

The Barry M. Goldwater Scholarship and Excellence in Education Program was established by Congress in 1986 to honor Senator Barry M. Goldwater, who served his country for 56 years as a soldier and statesman, including 30 years of service in the U.S. Senate. The purpose of the Foundation is to provide a continuing source of highly qualified scientists, mathematicians, and engineers by awarding scholarships to college students who intend to pursue careers in these fields.

Award: Up to \$7,500 USD a year
