The genesis of my professional work and studio pedagogy on architectonics and building-integrated housing originates in my "Architecture can Heal: Universal Elements and The Common Ground" Thesis [advised by Lebbeus Woods] from The Cooper Union, which received numerous awards for its experimental focus on how environment—light, air, water, wind—can influence the architectonic framework of intimately scaled architectural elements such as walls, columns, doors, and windows and quotidian objects such as chairs and tables, serving as a universal alphabet of design fundamentals. In 2013, I started an independent atelier where I continue to develop elements and objects through rigorous project testing and actualization of built form. My extensive professional work and experience encompasses an array of public and private programs, ranging in scale from schools and museums to the intimate and carefully detailed construction of domestic residences, with built work across New York, New Jersey, and overseas.

ACADEMIC POSITIONS

I have been dedicated to teaching and coordinating a wide range of award-winning studios and research seminars at The Cooper Union School of Architecture since 2005, with a focus on universal elements, building-integrated housing, and architectonics. My teaching and the work of my students have been recognized by the prestigious Studio Prize from Architect Magazine for Top Studio in North America, the RIBA Royal Medal for "World's Best Projects," and featured in numerous exhibitions, conferences, and publications. I also coordinate, teach and structure the curricular framework for The Cooper Union's summer program for high school and college students, which has since quadrupled in size (130+ annual participants) and provides exciting teaching opportunities for both our students and faculty. The first eight years of my teaching on civic urbanism were published in "Open City: Existential Approach by Charta," and my recent research, "Healing the City: Elemental Constructions and the Universal Language of Architecture," was selected and published in the ACSA New Instrumentalities chapter. These elemental conditions were implemented in my new building-integrated "collective-living" housing studio initiative at The Cooper Union, which I taught and coordinated in collaboration with HELP USA, a not-for-profit organization, and the New York City Housing Authority, NYCHA. This collaborative studio framework focused on providing affordable housing in New York City for individuals living alone; families and individuals with children; multigenerational households; the elderly; and people living with disabilities.

Since 2024, I have served in a leadership role as the Acting Associate Dean at The Cooper Union School of Architecture, where I recently led the school's successful re-accreditation review by the National Architectural Accrediting Board (NAAB), a major milestone that occurs every eight years. Additional highlights include advancing institutional goals and leading the development of our curriculum, faculty advisor program, public partnerships, and planning and assessment protocols—in collaboration with the Schools of Art, Engineering, and the Humanities Department—to ensure the highest level of education for our students.

PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE

My professional experience in architecture over the last twenty years captures a variety of project scales and programs, including the High School of Art & PS 59 in New York, a Net Zero Energy School in Staten Island, Elizabeth Academic High School in New Jersey, and numerous DOB-approved domestic residences in New York, New Jersey, and overseas. My design approach balances experimental sensibility with rigorous attention to construction details and materiality that are innovative, playful, inspiring, and inviting to its users. My recent professional work on multi-functional domestic objects, which explores the surreal effects of nature-activated phenomena and community interaction within Central Park in New York, was published in "Conceiving the Plan: Nuance and Intimacy in Civic Space" by SKIRA. This project was also exhibited at the recent Venice Biennale for Architecture. The multi-scalar framework these elements hold is conceptually linked through the lens of design universality, a multitude of functions, accessibility, and an embrace of diverse groups—from children to the elderly and individuals with physical disabilities. Hidden dynamic aspects within these architectural elements and objects encourage spatial flexibility that can be customized directly by their users to bring joy through the unexpected re-shaping of space, materiality, and programmatic function within their daily lives.
