Philosophy, History and Society

Philosophy

- 3 credits in ancient or Eastern philosophy (e.g., Pythagoras: The Philosophy of Number; The Life and Death of Socrates; Plato's *Republic*; East of the Euphrates: Philosophy in the Eastern Hemisphere);
- 6 credits in modern and contemporary philosophy (e.g., Ethics; Philosophy of Science; Science and Contemporary Thought; Critical Theory; Philosophy of Liberation; Foucault [HSS4, but could be taken as an elective];
- 3 credits in aesthetics or in cultural studies (e.g., Art and the Crisis of Modernity, Philosophy and Contemporary Art; Contemporary Culture and Criticism).

History

- 6 credits in pre-20th century history (e.g., The Early Modern Atlantic World; The Rise of the Modern City in the European Middle Ages; Urban Archaeology; New York, 1820-1920; Darwin and His Times);
- 6 credits in contemporary history (e.g., 20th Century History; American Social History; American Intellectual History; Culture and Society in the Weimar Republic; The American Presidency).

At least 3 credits of the above 12 must be in a non-Western category (e.g., History of Modern Asia; History of the Modern Middle East; African History).

Political Sciences

- 6 credits in sociological studies (e.g., Human Rights, Law, and Society; Urban Sociology; Postmodernism and Technology; Global Cities; Gender Studies; Am I That Name?; Environmental Sustainability; Science and Contemporary Thought);
- 6 credits in political science (e.g., Comparative Politics; Politics and Collective Memory; Politics of Ethnonational Conflict; American Foreign Policy; Public Policy in Contemporary America; The American Presidency).
