This list includes sample grants, fellowships, and scholarships related to the study and/or practice of architecture and related fields. Each is unique and offers its own benefits. Be sure to check each website to confirm details.

[AIA/Architects Foundation Diversity Advancement Scholarship](#)

Supports undergraduate minority students who are entering, enrolled in, or transferring into a NAAB-accredited undergraduate architecture program.

- Award: \$4,000 USD; annually over 5-years
- Eligibility: Undergraduate minority students
- Deadline: January 17

[AIA/The Payette Sho-Ping Chin Memorial Academic Scholarship](#)

Supports women studying architecture within a NAAB-accredited bachelor or master degree program.

- Award: \$10,000 USD
- Eligibility: U.S. Citizen; rising 3rd or 4th year undergraduate or graduate student
- Deadline: January 17

[A/E ProNet David W. Lakamp AIA Scholarship](#)

Supports students who best demonstrate strong interest in practice and risk management.

- Award: \$5,000 USD
- Eligibility: 4th year NAAB degree program; first year M.Arch/D.Arch degree program; 3.0 GPA
- Deadline: March 15

[Bogliasco Fellowships for the Arts and Humanities](#)

Given to individuals of all ages and nationalities who have made significant contributions in the arts and humanities.

- Award: Living quarters; separate private studios and full board
- Eligibility: Demonstrate significant achievement in their disciplines
- Deadline: January 15, 2018 for Fall 2018; April 15, 2018 for Spring 2019

[Center for Architecture Design Scholarship](#)

Merit-based scholarships that support students acquiring their first professional degree in architecture, design, engineering, planning, or a related discipline.

- Award: Up to \$5,000 USD
- Eligibility: Seeking first architecture degree in New York State; academic performance; financial need
- Deadline: March 15

[Connecticut Architecture Foundation Scholarship](#)

This organization's mission is to raise the public awareness of, and expectations for, Architecture and the built environment.

- Award: \$1,200–\$5,000 USD
- Eligibility: Full-time student; enrolled or accepted to Architecture degree program
- Deadline: April 20

[Douglas Haskell Award for Student Journals](#)

Encourages student journalism on architecture, planning, and related subjects, and to foster regard for intelligent criticism among future professionals.

- Award: Up to \$2,000 USD
- Eligibility: Any journal published; must have been produced in the current or previous year
- Deadline: May 1

[Enterprise Rose Architectural Fellowship](#)

Partners emerging architectural designers with local community development organizations, where they facilitate an inclusive approach to development to create green, sustainable, and affordable communities.

- Award: \$52,000 USD annual three-year stipend
- Eligibility: Bachelor's degree in architecture; eligible to work in the U.S
- Deadline: December 10

[Henry Adams Medal and Certificate Program](#)

Awards a medal and certificate of merit to the top-ranking graduating student in each architecture program. Must be nominated by institution.

[Jason Pettigrew Memorial ARE Scholarship](#)

Aides to defray costs associated with the Architect Registration Examination (ARE) and it recognizes the significant contributions of those in the early stages of their career.

- Award: Covers full cost of Architect Registration Examination; study materials
- Eligibility: AIA member; ARE candidate
- Deadline: Visit website

[Joseph L. and Vivian E. Steele Architecture Scholarship](#)

Grant scholarships to students in need of financial assistance.

- Award: Up to \$5,000 USD
- Eligibility: Studying in final three-years of Architecture program; financial need; present/former resident of Central Pennsylvania counties
- Deadline: February 15

[Municipal Engineers Scholarship Program](#)

Professional organization dedicated to improving the engineering standards on municipal construction projects in Greater New York.

- Award: \$1,000–\$2,500 USD
- Eligibility: Undergraduate Architecture or Engineering major
- Deadline: October 31

[NAWIC Founders' Scholarship Foundation \(Women in Construction\)](#)

Assist in providing the construction industry with trained employees through higher education.

- Award: \$500–\$2,500 USD
- Eligibility: 3.0 GPA; enrolled in construction-related degree program; enrolled full-time
- Deadline: February 28

[Rome Prize - American Academy in Rome](#)

Supports innovative and cross-disciplinary work in the arts and humanities.

- Award: Stipend; room and board; individual workspace
- Eligibility: U.S. Citizen; bachelor's degree
- Deadline: November 15

[The Concrete Industry Foundation Inc.](#)

Provides financial assistance to students preparing for careers in the design and construction industry, with special emphasis on study related to concrete.

- Award: Visit website
- Eligibility: U.S. Citizen; permanent NYC resident; attending NYC institution
- Deadline: Visit website

Provides grants for research projects proposed by passionate and curious students of architecture, architectural history, and urban studies.

- Award: \$5,000 USD annually in travel/study grants
- Eligibility: Recent graduate
- Deadline: April 23

[The Loeb Fellowship](#)

Supports accomplished practitioners who are influential in shaping the built and natural environment, whose work is advancing positive social outcomes in the US and around the world.

- Award: Tuition; \$50,000 USD stipend; housing and travel grant
- Eligibility: Mid-career; 5–10 years of experience in the field
- Deadline: January 5

[Whitney Museum of American Art - Independent Study Program \(ISP\)](#)

The ISP provides a setting within which students pursuing an art practice, curatorial work, art historical and architectural scholarship, and critical writing engage in ongoing discussions and debates that examine the historical, social, and intellectual conditions of artistic production.

- Award: \$1,800 USD
- Eligibility: Graduate student; recent undergraduate; international applicants
- Deadline: April 1

[Women's Auxiliary Eleanor Allwork Scholarship](#)

Supports architecture students with demonstrated financial need. Must be nominated by the dean or chair of the school of architecture in which they are currently studying.

- Award: Up to \$7,500 USD
- Eligibility: Seeking first architecture degree in New York State; need not be U.S. citizen
- Deadline: March 15
