# Abrons Arts Center Artist in Residency Program: (New York, NY)

- Typical Deadline: September
- Provided: Depending on which residency you participate in, studio / production / exhibition space
- Length: Roughly 4 months, September—December | February—May

#### Art Kibbutz Residency: (Governors Island, NY)

- Typical Deadline: Contact organization
- Provided: Jewish engagement, community, exposure at the Governors Island Art Fair
- Length: Contact organization

#### Artists Alliance LES Studio Residency: (New York, NY)

- Typical Deadline: Contact organization
- Provided: 24-hour studio access, AAI—organized studio visits, a gallery exhibition
- Length: 3-6 months

#### Baxter St / NY Camera Club: (New York, NY)

- Typical Deadline: November
- Provided: Free access to the darkrooms, Digital Lab & Shooting Studio at the International Center of Photography, as well as the Baxter St at CCNY facilities, free admission to all 2018 Baxter St events, a 10% discount on classes, free Fujifilm and Awagami Factory paper, a monthly stipend of \$1,000, a solo exhibition at Baxter St with additional funding (currently between \$2,000-\$5,000)
- Length: 3 months

#### Bronx Museum AIM Residency: (New York, NY)

- Application available in June
- Provided: Professional development opportunities, a series of 15 seminars on: Writing, Fundraising, Art Law, Art
- Criticism, Marketing, Financial Planning, and Career Management, and an exhibition
- Length: See website

#### Center for Book Arts: (New York, NY)

• Typical Deadline: October

• Provided: Space and support

• Length: 1 year

#### Center of Photography at Woodstock: (Woodstock, NY)

- Typical Deadline: January
- Provided: Housing, studio, facilities, stipend for food and travel
- Length: 4-6 weeks

# **Chashama:** (NYC and Hudson Valley)

- Typical Deadline: July
- Provided: Subsidized studios and a residency program in the Hudson Valley housing, and food
- Length: 4 weeks / Fee: Each session is \$900

# The Clemente Center Residency: (New York, NY)

- Typical Deadline: Ongoing
- Provided: Long term subsidized art studio
- Length: See website

### <u>Dieu Donne Workspace Residency</u>: (New York, NY)

- Typical Deadline: October
- Provided: An opportunity to explore hand paper making and work collaboratively with master papermakers
- Length: Contact organization

# <u>Drawing Center Open Session Residency</u>: (New York, NY)

- Typical Deadline: February
- Provided: Commitment of occasional events, collaboratively organized exhibitions
- · Length: 2 years

### **Drop Forge and Tool: (Hudson, NY)**

- Typical Deadline: November
- Provided: Ability to host a performance, open studio, or other type of showing. In the past, they've had theater performances, house concerts, book release parties, open readings, small gallery viewings and open studios
- Length: Few days—3 weeks / Fee: \$175 per person, per week, discount on groups

### Edward F. Albee Foundation: (Montauk, NY)

- Typical Deadline: March
- Provided: Studio and housing (May—October)
- Length: 4–6 weeks / Fee: No fee, but residents are responsible for their food, travel, and other expenses

# \*Elizabeth Foundation for the Arts Studio Program: (New York, NY)

- Typical Deadline: October
- Provided: A subsidized studio
- Length: Up to 2 years

### \*Eyebeam Residency: (Brooklyn, NY)

- Typical Deadline: Check back in the Spring
- Provided: Up to \$30,000 for up to 1 year, minimum commitment of 8 hours/day, 3 days/week
- Extra Details: Prestigious award for artists engaged with technology and technologists working in the Arts; residents receive access to top-notch facilities as well as frequent critiques and mentorship
- Length: 1 year

# <u>Genesee Centre for the Arts and Education Residency:</u> (Rochester, NY)

- Typical Deadline: Ongoing
- Provided: Access to classes, basic studio supplies, and facilities. Ceramics Residents receive a \$1,500 firing stipend and materials at cost plus 10%
- Extra Details: Residency is specifically for book arts, photography, and ceramics
- Length: 3-12 months

#### **Harvestworks**: (New York, NY)

- Typical Deadline: Ongoing
- Provided: 24/7 scheduled time for access to the Technology, Engineering, Art and Music (TEAM) Lab
- Length: Contact organization / Fee: \$650/month for a private studio 170 square feet or \$350/month for access to their own desk space with internet

# **Institute for Electronic Arts: (Alfred, New York)**

- Typical Deadline: January
- Provided: Lodging, a stipend, travel, technology access, materials and technical assistance
- Length: 1−2 weeks

# <u>International Studio & Curatorial Program (ISCP)</u>: (Brooklyn, NY)

- Typical Deadline: Ongoing
- Provided: Private studio, and professional development
- Length: 1 year

### Interstate Projects Studio Program: (Brooklyn, NY)

• Typical Deadline: 3 times per year/see website

• Provided: Studio space

· Length: 4 months

### Lightwork, at Syracuse University: (Syracuse, NY)

• Typical Deadline: July

• Provided: \$5,000 stipend, a furnished apartment, 24-hour access to facilities

• Length: 1 month

# \*Lower Manhattan Cultural Council (LMCC): (New York, NY)

• Typical Deadline: January

• Provided: Free studio, \$1,100 is provided, (there is NOT a monthly living or housing stipend)

• Length: 9 months

# The Millay Colony for the Arts: (Austerlitz, NY)

• Typical Deadline: October 1 or March 1

 Provided: 2 weeks—1 month, April—November, private bedroom and studio

 Extra Details: Has a Virtual Artist Residency and Group Artist Residency

• Length: 2 weeks-1 month

#### NARS Foundation: (Brooklyn, NY)

• Typical Deadline: See website

 Provided: Studio space, 4–6 studio visits per month, professional development

• Length: 3 months / Fee: \$1,500

#### **OMI Arts: (Ghent, NY)**

 Provided: Logistical support, production support, documentation support and lots of network support

• Typical Deadline: January

• Provided: Housing, studio, development program

• Length: 1-6 months / Fee: \$600-\$1,000 per month

### Watermill Center: (Long Island, NY)

#### Women's Studio Workshop: (Rosendale, NY)

- Provided: \$350/week, \$500 for materials, \$250 for travel, housing, and studio
- Extra Details: Studio disciplines: intaglio, letterpress, papermaking, screen printing, photography, or ceramics, offers many additional grants, see website
- Length: 6-8 weeks (September-June)

#### \*Yaddo: (Saratoga Spring, NY)

- Typical Deadline: January
- Provided: Studio, housing, and meals
- Length: 2–8 weeks
